Digitalisation of judicial cooperation in civil matters



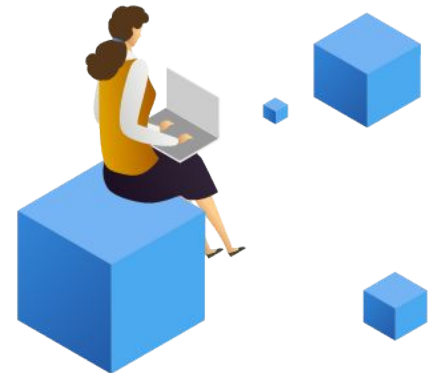
What type of cooperation?

- Civil and commercial matters :
 - Existing EU instruments on :
 - civil procedure
 - (final stage of negotiation) divorces, parental responsibility, small claims, contractual disputes, successions etc.
 - All future instruments: e.g. recognition of parenthood, cross-border protection of adults
- Cross-border cases:
 - Cross-border is defined by each instrument
 - Within the EU
 - Involving an authority
- Exclusion of:
 - Purely national cases (except VC)
 - Disruptions of the system
 - Non compatible nature of documents
 - Informal communications (judicial communications, EJN)



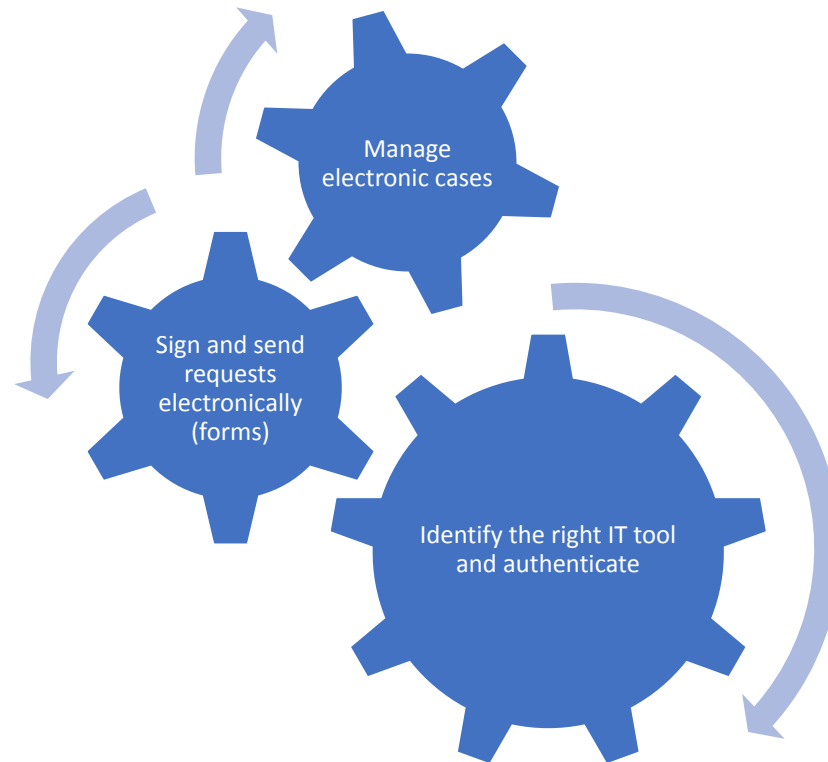
Who should be trained?

- Judges and court staff (civil and commercial courts)
- Caseworkers of central authorities
- Competent authorities : notaries, bailiffs, child protection officers...
- Lawyers

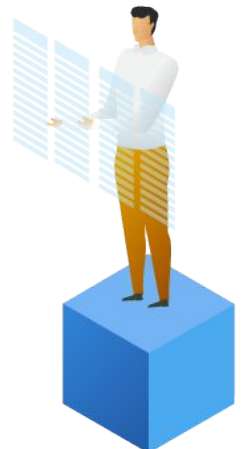
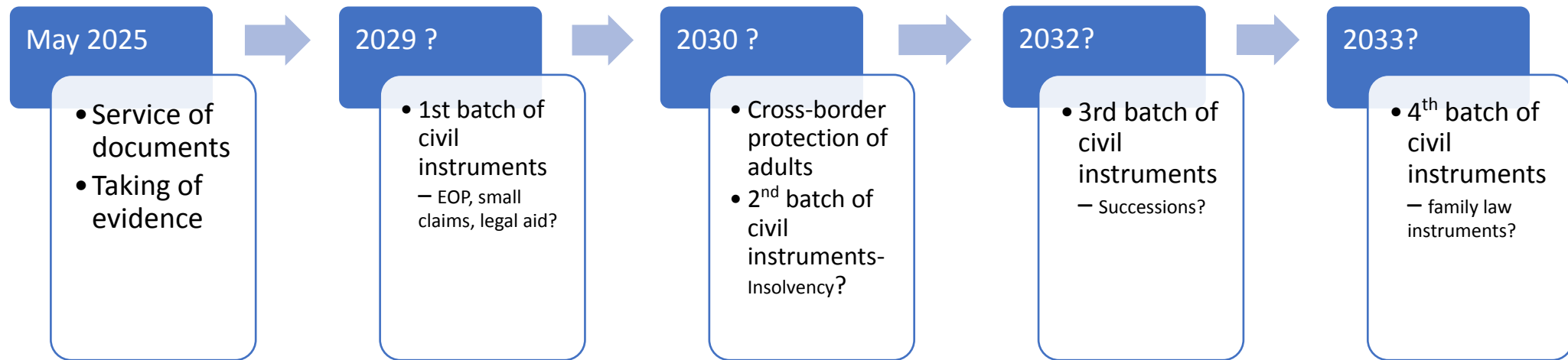


New channels : new skills

- Authority to authority
 - A common software developed by the European Commission (*reference implementation system*) for each instrument
 - **Or** specific module(s) of the national IT system(s)
- Authority to natural or legal persons
 - The European electronic access point
 - **Or** specific module(s) of national IT system(s) or website(s)
